Op Clean sweep 2

Local residents had complained about drunken people causing anti-social behaviour by littering and defecating around the arches at Dock Street at the junction with Mint Street, St Katharine's and Wapping SNT



resolved to swiftly eliminate this problem. We undertook operation "Clean Sweep two", a proven tactical intervention with joint partners that was successfully used in the past. People had set up mattresses and bedding to form a sleeping area and were socializing in the early hours. All the detritus was removed by Veolia Street Cleansing, the area was pressure washed and an abandoned dog was seized at the location.

Drugs address closure

Police attended an address in Wapping working alongside the Council to foreclose a premise and seek an eviction order. This was due to information from local residents of drugs misuse and anti-social behaviour from inside the property. The tenant was arrested for supplying class A drugs and two squatters were also removed from the property. The property has now being fully secured. This has stopped the activities that were causing a nuisance and misery throughout the day and night to residents.

Brothel closure

SNT officers were made aware of a brothel near Cable Street. Following partnership engagement with the local housing authority enquiries were immediately undertaken. The occupiers were identified and following police intervention have now left the premises.

Around the Borough

A review of public 'access channels' started on the 11th April and concluded on the 27th May. It is looking at how we can enable the public to communicate with police and access policing services more effectively. A key aim of the review is to identify the role front counters play in the wide range of public access channels, from calls and online contact to face to face meetings. To support public consultation, the online survey asked a range of questions about communication with police and access to the services at front counters. No decisions have yet been taken. No changes will be made to the current level of front counters service without thorough consultation and approval from our Management Board and the MPA.
